Early Childhood Family Education

Early childhood Family Education (ECFE) is a program that is offered to all Minnesota families with children between the ages of birth and kindergarten. It is the largest and oldest program of its kind in the country and involves approximately 300,000 Minnesota parents and children each year. ECFE's message is that what parents do is vitally important to the development of their children.

Canby Public Schools has an extensive ECFE program for its youngest students. Students enjoy attending evening classes with their parents in Terrific Two's, Thrilling three's. The ECFE day programs of Little Learners, Little Lancers, and Little Lancers Plus allow students to come to school without their parents for two, three or four full days of school a week. The students take part in learning activities developmentally appropriate for their age that help foster the skills necessary for kindergarten entrance. The ECFE day programs utilize the Starfall Preschool curriculum program at Canby Elementary.

Elementary school begins Tuesday, Sept. 5

The elementary school classes for grades K-6 will begin at 8:10 a.m., on Tuesday, September 5. Upon entering the building, students are to report to their assigned classroom.

St. Peter’s Open House

There will be an open house and free hotdog meal held on Wednesday, Aug. 30, 5-6:30 p.m., at St. Peter’s School. A free hotdog meal will be served. Students may bring their backpacks and supplies, see their classrooms and meet their teachers.

School-wide Open House

School wide open house for Little Learners, Little Lancers, Little Lancers Plus and Grades K-6 will be held on **Wednesday, Aug. 30 starting at 5 p.m. and running until 7 p.m.** There will be a burger feed. Students and their parent/guardian will have the opportunity to meet his/her teacher and drop off school supplies in their classrooms. Little Learners and Little Lancer plus classes will begin on Tuesday, Sept. 5, and Little Lancers class will begin on Wednesday, Sept. 6.

School Bus Routes and Use of School Buses

Letters regarding bus routes are mailed out to parents at the end of August. If you did not receive a letter and feel your child should be on a route, please contact Steve Schanning at 507-223-2004.

The school board has recognized Hwy 75, Hwy 68, and the Truck Bypass Road (Fairground Road) as “hazard” roadways. This means that elementary students should not cross these roadways from their homes or child care addresses to reach their bus stops or their schools. Therefore, even though an elementary school student may live less than one mile from school, if that student would be required to cross a roadway designated by the school board as a hazard, that student can be transported to and from school on a school bus. **If you have a child in grades K-6 that you would**

like picked up before school or dropped off after school on a regular basis at one of the designated pickup points, please contact the elementary school office for more information.

The school buses are provided for your transportation to and from your home and school. Because of the routing, it is impossible to allow extra passengers to use a certain bus at will. Consequently, no students are to ride a bus other than their assigned bus without written permission from the office. Please contact your child’s school office to obtain permission to ride. Any note from a parent or guardian to ride district transportation is required to be signed by the office. Special permission may be granted in cases of family emergency, but not for parties or social events.

Winter Storm Policy

In the early morning hours, during inclement weather, the following radio or TV stations will be notified of school closing or late starts: WCCO-Twin Cities, KMHL-Marshall, KELO-Sioux Falls, KDMA-Montevideo, KARZ-Marshall, KSFY-Sioux Falls, Q102-Willmar, KSTP-Twin Cities/Alex, FOX9 Twin Cities, KARE11 Twin Cities, and KLQP-Madison.

A two-hour late start means weather conditions will be reviewed and a decision will be made to either stay with the late start or dismissal for the entire day. Parents are advised to listen for last minute changes. Worsening weather conditions may force the early closing of schools. If this should happen, the above radio and TV stations will carry this information. On such a day, our phone lines can at times become jammed. Do not plan for your child to contact you by phone. Be prepared in advance. We will follow your instructions on the emergency form if the buses cannot take students home.

Instant Alert

Canby Public Schools will use a telephone broadcast system to notify all households and parents by phone within minutes of an emergency or unplanned event that causes early dismissal, school cancellation or late start. The service may also be used from time-to-time to communicate general announcements or reminders. This service is provided by JMC, a school-to-parent communications company. Canby Public Schools will continue to report school weather closings on the radio and TV stations used in the past and will use this system as an overlay to the public announcements.

In use, the service will call all phone numbers provided by parents on our selected contact list and will deliver a recorded message from a school administrator. The service will deliver messages to both live answer and answering machines. No answers (40 sec. ring time) and busy signals will be automatically retried twice in 15-minute intervals after the initial call.

In addition, the district will also post the announcement to the district’s website and Facebook page. In some circumstances an email or text message may be sent to parents.

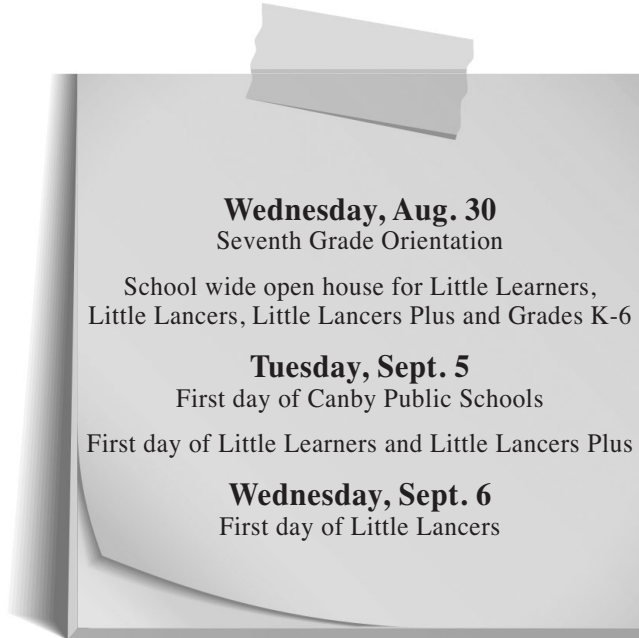
