EARLY CHILDHOOD FAMILY EDUCATION

Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) is a program that is offered to all Minnesota families with children from birth to kindergarten. It is the largest and oldest program of its kind in the country and involves approximately 300,000 Minnesota parents and children each year. ECFE’s message is that what parents do is vitally important to the development of their children.

Canby Public Schools has an extensive ECFE program for its youngest students. Students enjoy attending evening classes with their parents in Terrific Twos and Thrilling Threes. The ECFE day programs of Little Learners, Little Lancers, and Little Lancers Plus allow students to come to school without their parents for two, three, or four full days of school a week. The students take part in learning activities that are developmentally appropriate for their age, helping to foster the skills necessary for kindergarten entrance. The ECFE day programs utilize the Starfall Preschool curriculum program at Canby Elementary.

2026-27 FREE OR REDUCED PRICE MEALS

Free or reduced price meals are available to enrolled students attending Canby Public Schools and St. Peter’s Catholic School in Canby. Each of these participating school food authorities and institutions have a copy of the policy for free or reduced price meals or free milk which may be reviewed by any interested party.

Application forms have been sent to all homes of enrolled children with a letter to parents or guardians. To apply for free or reduced price meals or free milk benefits, households must complete the application as soon as possible, sign it and return it to the school institution. Please contact the district office if you have any questions at 507-223-2001.

POLICY FOR OVERDUE OBLIGATIONS

Students are required to complete commitments and pay obligations due to using the facilities, materials or participating in programs offered at Canby Public Schools.

These include but are not limited to overdue lunch account balances, unpaid class dues, and book fines.

HIGH SCHOOL LUNCH HOUR

Lunchtime will be closed for grades 7-10. No student in grades 7-10 is allowed to leave the building and/or school grounds without checking out in the high school office and obtaining a green pass. It is requested that parents/guardians allow students to leave during noon hour for emergency purposes only.

Students in grades 11 and 12 will have an open lunchtime and will be allowed to leave unless a parent/guardian requests that they not be able to leave during lunchtime.

INSTANT ALERT

Canby Public Schools will use a telephone broadcast system to notify all households and parents by phone within minutes of an emergency or unplanned event that causes early dismissal, school cancellation or late start. The service may also be used from time to time to communicate general announcements or reminders. JMC, a school-to-parent communications company, provides this service. Canby Public Schools will continue to report school weather closings on the radio and TV stations used in the past and will use this system as an overlay to the public announcements.

In use, the service will call all phone numbers provided by parents on our selected contact list and will deliver a recorded message from a school administrator. The service will deliver messages to both live answering machines and answering machines. No answers (40 sec. ring time) and busy signals will be automatically retried twice in 15-minute intervals after the initial call.

In addition, the district will also post the announcement to the district’s website and Facebook page. In some circumstances, an email or text message may be sent to parents.

SCHOOL BUS ROUTES AND
USE OF SCHOOL BUSES

Letters regarding bus routes are mailed out to parents at the end of August. If you did not receive a letter and feel your child should be on a route, please contact the bus garage at 507-223-2004.

The school board has recognized Hwy. 75, Hwy. 68 and the Truck Bypass Road (Fairground Road) as “hazard” roadways. This means that elementary students should not cross these roadways from their homes or child care addresses to reach their bus stops or their schools. Therefore, even though an elementary school student may live less than one mile from school, if that student would be required to cross a roadway designated by the school board as a hazard, that student can be transported to and from school on a school bus. If you have a child in grades K-6 who needs regular before-school or after-school pickup at one of the designated pickup points, please contact the elementary school office for more information.

The school buses are provided for your transportation to and from your home and school. Because of the routing, it is impossible to allow extra passengers to use a certain bus at will. Consequently, no students are to ride a bus other than their assigned bus without written permission from the office. Please contact your child’s school office to obtain permission to ride. Any note from a parent or guardian to ride the district transportation is required to be signed by the office. Special permission may be granted in cases of family emergency but not for parties or social events.

‘BELL TO BELL’ PHONE-FREE POLICY

Canby High School has a “bell-to-bell” cell phone policy for students in grades seven through 12. Under the policy, students must store their phones, smartwatches and earbuds in secure Yondr pouches, which remain locked during the entire school day to minimize distractions and improve engagement. Each student will be assigned a numbered pouch to use throughout the year and will secure their device during first period, keeping the pouch with them until it’s unlocked at designated bases when leaving school. The decision aims to enhance learning, social interaction and student wellness.

WINTER STORM POLICY

In the early morning hours during inclement weather, the following radio or TV stations will be notified of school closings or late starts: WCCO-Twin Cities, KMHL-Marshall, KELO-Sioux Falls, KDMA-Montevideo, KARZ-Marshall, KSFY-Sioux Falls, Q102-Willmar, KSTP-Twin Cities/Alex, FOX 9 Twin Cities, KARE 11 Twin Cities and KLQP-Madison.

A two-hour late start means weather conditions will be reviewed, and a decision will be made to either stay with the late start or dismiss for the entire day. Parents are advised to listen for last-minute changes.

Worsening weather conditions may force the early closing of schools. If this should happen, the above radio and TV stations will carry this information.

On such a day, our phone lines can at times become jammed. Do not plan for your child to contact you by phone. Be prepared in advance. We will follow your instructions on the emergency form if the buses cannot take students home.
